








# Animals Year 2 Autumn 2

<b>adult</b>	A fully grown animal or plant.	Some animals give birth to <b>live young</b> . 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>I can explain how the offspring of animals differ.</li> <li>I can explain the life cycle of an animal.</li> <li>I can explain the basic needs of an animal.</li> </ul>
<b>develop</b>	To grow bigger and become stronger.	Some animals lay eggs which the <b>young</b> hatch from. 	
<b>Life cycle</b>	The changes living things go through to become an adult.	Both of these types of <b>young</b> then <b>develop</b> into <b>adults</b> .	
<b>offspring</b>	The child of an animal.	Some <b>offspring</b> look like their <b>adult</b> when they are born.  	<b>Fact</b> Dogs and cats have unique nose prints, just like human fingerprints.
<b>young</b>	Offspring that has not reached adulthood.	Some <b>offspring</b> do not look like their <b>adult</b> when they are born.  	<b>Life cycles</b> 
<b>Live young</b>	Offspring that has not hatched from an egg.
