the necessary knowledge and skills to succeed. This ensures that skills and knowledge are built on year by year and sequenced appropriately to maximise learning for children.

The Kapow scheme for PSHE covers wider PSHE learning, in line with the requirement of the national curriculum (2014). Children's learning through this scheme will significantly contribute to their personal development. The scheme promotes the four fundamental British values of democracy, rule of law, respect and tolerance, and individual liberty. It also includes learning and resources for well-being.
