A visual representation of music.

Improvise:

Music that is made up on the spot, without any preparation.




Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart 1756 - 1791

He is considered as one of the greatest composers in the history of western music.

Thought to be a child prodigy; composing from 5 years old.

He composed over 800 pieces of music.
